

Have your say on our Resident Parking Permit Policy

We know parking is important.

People with cars want to be able to park near their home, as well as visitors, carers, service providers and tradespeople.

There are often not enough on-street spaces for everyone who'd like them. This is when we need to manage parking so that spaces are available for those who need them most.

Our Resident Parking Permit Policy outlines who can get permits. It aims to ensure fair distribution of parking permits throughout Darebin, particularly where there is a high need.

Since the policy was introduced our diverse community has continued to grow and change, as have our parking needs.

We've developed four options we think could improve the current policy. The options range from small adjustments to big changes. We'd also like to know if there are other parking permit needs our community has, such as the needs of families, of multigenerational and numerous adult households, and other exceptional circumstances where a permit might be needed.

What do you think about the options? What other ideas do you have when it comes to residential parking permits? We want to hear your thoughts.

Our current policy

Darebin's Resident Parking Permit Policy provides guidance around who is eligible for resident parking permits. It aims to ensure fair distribution of on-street parking permits throughout Darebin, particularly where there is a high need.

Currently there are two types of parking permits available:

- Resident parking permit sticker, attached to vehicle windshield OR transferable between vehicles.
- Temporary permits for up to four weeks.

These permits are available to all people who live on a Darebin street where parking restrictions apply, as long as their house was built before December 2004.

The 2004 Rule

People living in houses built after December 2004 are currently not eligible for most types of parking permits. This is known as the '2004 rule' in Darebin.

The purpose of the '2004 rule' is to ensure that when additional homes are built in Darebin, they also include enough parking space on-site to meet the parking needs of occupants.

Your questions answered

Didn't Council already try to introduce blanket parking restrictions in 2019? Why are you trying it again?

It's important to know this is different to the Darebin Parking Strategy and policies that we sought feedback on in 2019. These were rejected after the community told us they did not meet people's needs.

How is this different?

This is about the Resident Parking Permit Policy only. Parking permits are different from parking restrictions.

Parking restrictions place time limits on how long people can park in streets. They apply to people who do not have a Resident Parking Permit. As a result of community feedback in 2019, parking restrictions are determined on a street-by-street basis at community request.

What is the process for deciding parking restrictions?

When a community request to consider parking restrictions is received and approved, households and businesses in that street (and sometimes surrounding streets) receive letters informing them and inviting their input. So what is this policy about?

The Resident Parking Permit Policy we are asking for your input on here is not about parking restrictions but how best to allocate parking permits. This policy is not about determining which streets should have parking restrictions, or how long restrictions should be. It's about who should be eligible for parking permits on streets where restrictions are in place.

Why is the policy being updated?

The review of Council's Resident Parking Permit Policy is an action item within the Council Plan 2021-2025. The parking policy needs to be reviewed to ensure it achieves greater equity, responds to the needs of our changing community and is user-friendly.

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Option 1: *Small change:* Carer permits for all, visitor permits simplified

Positives

Carer Permit



- People who receive care will be eligible for carer permits.
- Policy aligned to neighbouring councils.
- Visitor permits simplified.

 Does not improve access to parking permits for people in developments built after December 2004.

Option 2: *Medium change:* Carer permits for all, permits for some post-2004 homes, visitor permits simplified

Positives



- People who receive care will be eligible for carer permits.
- People living in one or two homes on a lot built after December 2004 will have access to parking permits.
- People renovating existing houses without off-street parking will be eligible for parking permits.

Negatives



- May result in more car ownership, more contested parking and traffic on local roads.
- Cost of parking permits may be increased to manage demand.

Option 3: *Big change:* More permits for more people, relaxation of eligibility requirements

Positives

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- People who receive care will be eligible for carer permits.
- More people will have access to parking permits, regardless of when their houses were built.
- People renovating existing houses without off-street parking will be eligible for parking permits.

Negatives



- May result in more car ownership, more contested parking and traffic on local roads.
- Cost of parking permits may be increased to manage demand.
- May encourage developers to not provide enough parking to meet occupant needs.
- People in three or four home developments must choose between resident permit or daily visitor permits.

Option 4: Significant change: Major overhaul of current policy

- Parking permits allocated based on the amount of on-street parking available in the street, prioritised by need.
- Permits allocated based on a highest needs priority system. For example:
 - 1. Carer permits/ Accessible parking.
 - 2. Homes without off-street parking.
 - 3. Homes with 1 off-street parking space.
 - 4. Homes with 2 off-street parking spaces.
 - 5. All other homes.
- Available permits capped at a percentage of the total number of parking spaces in a street e.g. 85%, allowing visitors to access some parking spaces and providing some flexibility.
- Permits allocated one at a time in annual 'allocation rounds' based on a
 priority system. Residents can apply for more than 1 permit, but can only
 receive 1 permit in each 'allocation round'.
- The allocation process stops once the permit cap is reached or when all applicants have received a permit.
- All households eligible for carer permit if required.
- Daily visitor permits available for eligible households, with an annual cap of 100.

Positives



- There will not be more permits allocated than parking spaces available in a street.
- A more flexible approach than the current policy.

Negatives



- Does not provide long-term certainty.
- May be complex and confusing.
- Making more parking permits available and easier to access may result in more car ownership, more contested parking on residential streets, and more traffic on local roads.
- Cost of parking permits may be increased to manage demand.
